

Health and Safety on the Job:

Every year about **70 teens die** from work related injuries in the United States. Another **70,000 get hurt** badly enough that they go to a hospital emergency room. **HERE ARE THE FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW:**

If you are under 18 you are not allowed to do the following on the job:

- Drive a motor vehicle as a regular part of the job, or operate a forklift at any time
- Operate many types of powered equipment like a circular saw, box crusher, meat slicer, or bakery machine
- Work where there is exposure to radiation
- Work where explosives are manufactured or stored

It is illegal for teens under 18 to work in the following areas:

- Wrecking
- Demolition
- Excavation
- Roofing
- Mining
- Logging
- Sawmill
- Meat Packing
- Slaughtering

If you are 14 or 15 you are not allowed to do the following on the job:

- Bake or cook (except at a serving counter).
- Operate power-driven machinery (except those which pose little hazard such as those used in offices)
- Work on a ladder or scaffold
- Work in warehouses
- Work in construction, manufacturing, or building
- Load or unload a truck, railroad car, or conveyor

Employers are required to provide the following:

- A safe and healthful workplace
- Safety and health training in many situations
- For many jobs, payment for medical care if you get hurt or sick as a result of your job
- In addition, you may also receive lost wages.
- At least the Federal Minimum Wage of \$5.15 per hour to most teens after their first 90 days on the job. (lower wages apply when receiving tips from customers)

Work Hours for 14 & 15 year old Teens (exceptions are made for those in work study programs)

Work Hours:

- Labor Day - June 1: 7AM - 7PM
- Not during school hours
- June 1- Labor Day: 7AM-9PM

Maximum Work Hours during School:

- Maximum of 18 hours per week
- 3 hours max on school days
- 8 hours a day on Sat., Sun., & holidays

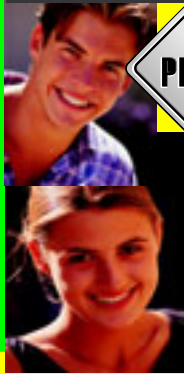
Maximum Work Hours when School is Out:

- 40 Hours per week
- 8 Hours max per day

Teen safety responsibilities on the job include:

- Follow all safety rules and instructions
- Use safety equipment and protective clothing when needed
- Look out for co-workers
- Keep work areas clean and neat
- Know what to do in an emergency
- Report any health and safety hazards to your supervisor
